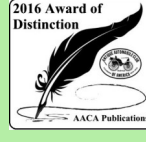
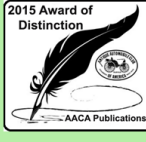
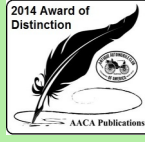

### 1951 Citroen Light 15

Loren's Citroen from South Africa

This is a 1951 Citroen Light 15. It is the British version of the Traction Avant, a French car made from 1934 to 1957. These cars were built with front wheel drive, unibody construction, rack and pinion steering, an OHV 4 cylinder, torsion bar suspension and hydraulic brakes. Although not the first car to introduce these features, it was the first mass-produced car to offer all this at a modest price.

Our Citroen was found in South Africa after we met members of the Citroen Club of South Africa at a show in Johannesburg. It was mechanically restored by an internationally known Citroen expert but still needs a repaint. Export to the USA took several months with the usual paperwork delays at both ends.



So far the car has only been shown once here. In August I drove it to Cruise Night at Wegmans . Gerry Lynn and Bill Boudway got to see it after I arrived late on account of making numerous long detours around CMAC concert police checkpoints (the car was still on SA plates).

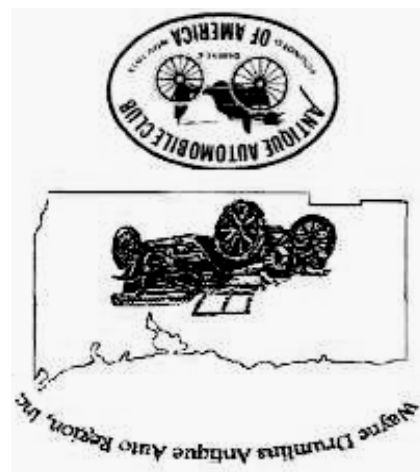
