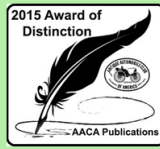

1911 Hupmobile, model 20
Owner, Stan Herdman

Hupmobiles were built from 1908 to 1941. The Model 20 was produced from 1908 to 1911.

Bore 3.25", stroke 3.625", 120.2 CID. It was listed as 20 Hp. However the early versions were listed as 16.9 Hp. but with no change in displacement, indicating they were under 20 Hp. The change may have been due to competing with Ford's Model T which was 20 Hp.

It also has a sliding gear transmission, steel disc clutch which is adjustable, and a Bosch magneto. Total weight of the car is a little over 1100 Lbs. giving it a good power to weight ratio.

I purchased this car in 1996 from a gentleman in Seneca Falls. It was not running and needed everything. After getting it, I planned to do most of the work so I kept track of the time. I had 2300 hours of labor during about four years. When it was done, we took it to Dublin, Ohio, for the AACA National meet where it got its first Junior in 2004. The following year it went to Greensburgh, Pa. where it got its Senior Award.
