Important Information

Last November Kidde issued a recall of many of their fire extinguishers. The recall involves 134 models of Kidde fire extinguishers manufactured between January 1, 1973 and August 15, 2017, including models that were previously recalled in March 2009 and February 2015. All of their plastic handle units with a vertical locking pin, along with the push button Pin-dicator models, are affected. Metal handle units and curved plastic handle units with horizontal pull pins are not part of the recall. These units were sold under not only the Kidde name, but also other names. A partial list includes: Ademco, ADT, All Purpose, Bicentennial, Costco, Fire Away, Force, Fuller, Fuller Brush, Gillette, Home, Honeywell, J.L., Kadet, KX, Mariner, Master Protection, Montgomery Ward, Quell, Sams, Sanford, Sears, Traveler, Volunteer, XL.



The units were sold in various sizes and red, silver, and white colors. The best advice is to look at what you have then go to the Kidde.com website. You can also Contact Kidde at (855) 271-0773 between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. EST Monday-Friday (excluding holidays), or between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. during the weekend to determine whether your extinguishers are affected. If you have a recalled extinguisher they will send a replacement free of charge and the paper work to return the old extinguisher.

These safety units are something none of us ever want to have to use, but a defective extinguisher is worse than no extinguisher at all.

Isn't Art Wonderful?

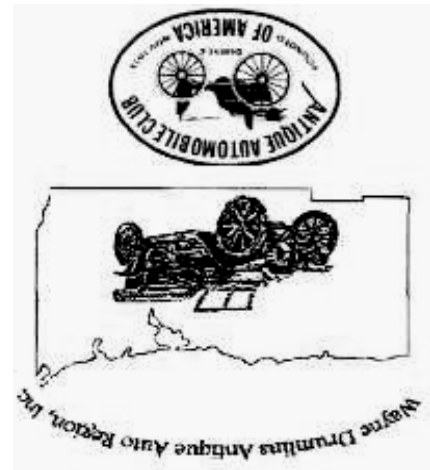
