1951 Crosley FarmOroad

This is me coming back from a mail run with my 1951 Crosley FarmOroad last Spring, picture caught on our driveway camera. Our mailbox is in a cluster about 1/2 mile away, which would not be a bad walk if it wasn't 200 feet lower than our house, so it doesn't get walked often (down

isn't a problem the back up sometimes is). Many in the Drumlins have seen it in years past, since I have had it for over 25 years. I bought it from my Dad who bought in 1976 and did a first pass at restoring but never completed the job once he got it looking good and drivable. I redid the paint and finished the reconditioning after I got it from him, doing all new wiring, brakes and assorted other small things he never got around to. The second picture (right) is my Dad towing his Airstream around the Crosley Nationals in 1981



with the FarmOroad. The sign says 1980 Nationals or Bust.

Editor's notes:

By doing a bit of research online I was able to find some additional information about the Crosley FarmOroad.

The FOR remained the same through all 3 years of production except for minor running improvements. Other than serial numbers there is no good way to tell the year of a FarmOroad. All were 63 inch wheelbase and 40 inch tread. They used a heavy duty open drive shaft with a 5.38:1 rear. They weighed approximately 1100 lbs depending on accessories. They used a stock Crosley transmission with a 4:1 Auxiliary transfer case that also supplied power to optional front and rear Power Take Off.

Based on statistical analysis of known serial numbers as of 1/98 the estimate is less than 600 FarmOroads were built.

Though these specs are for the two prototype FarmOroads built in 1947-1949, they give a reasonable idea as to what Jim has. They were less than spacious vehicles. Note how Jim, and his Dad, are a bit scrunched up as they drive.
