

I grew up on a muck farm Marion. My first car was a 1955 Chevy - the same model and color as the gem I have today. I purchased it used with 8,000 miles on it . The story goes that the original owner got married and could not afford both a new car and a new wife. He traded the car and I was fortunate to buy the car. I drove it for three years and traded it for a new one.

As the years passed, I had the urge to buy another one like the first one. My wife gave me a 1/16 scale model from Franklin Mint for Christmas in 2001. We kept looking for the real thing. We found one in Florida in 2003 and my friends found one in Michigan in 2005. I did not pursue either one. In August 2007 one of my friends saw this one for sale parked on routes 5 & 20 in Bloomfield about a week before. My wife and I went to see the car the next morning. Fortunately it was still there. I purchased the car and had it restored during the winter of 2008 -2009. It is a classic stock car.
