

Thought I would pass this along as a helpful tip for the Headliner. Last week I noticed a lot of white paint spray along the right side rocker area of my Jeep. I knew the State had been doing a lot of road striping, but could not figure out when or where I would have come in contact with them. Anyway the paint was quite heavy and it had dried completely. I contacted the DOT and got to a knowledgeable person that gave me this tip. Spray the paint area with windshield washer fluid and let it soak in. Repeat the spraying several times and then take a plastic ice scraper and scrape the paint to be removed. It takes a little work but I was able to remove all the overspray without damaging the car’s paint. The DOT person told me that a lot of body shops use this technique and I must say it worked quite well.


