
It's our club, let's resolve to have more fun together in 2012.

Installing Turn Signals in a Model A! By Micky Bohne VP Membership



You may think

this is a technical article but I assure you that it is not. In July we purchased a perfect Model A. By perfect I mean that it was perfect for us. It has an older restoration with worn but drivable tires, and the paint doesn't quite shine but after building several 'show' cars, this car was perfect. It was a driver.

We trailered the car home and after parking it in the gar-age, Hubby de-clared that all it needed was turn signals and it would be ready to roll. It was a great buy and a great day. We had a National meet coming up, so we ordered the turn signal kit knowing that when we returned from the meet the kit would have arrived and we could install the turn signals. On the return trip home from the meet, Hubby informs me that he had been talking with some of his friends and has determined that our lives will become complete if we install a lift in our garage. We are not getting any younger, I am told, and working on the cars while lying on the floor is becoming harder to do. (Having spent many hours on my own back staring at the undercarriage of more than one brass era car, I concurred that a lift might not be a bad idea.) Hubby tells me that in a conversation with his friend Jim, Jim said that he is rather sold on a Brand X lift and is seriously thinking of buying one himself. So, upon returning home, Hubby spent countless hours online devouring every printed word he could find about the Brand X lift. Drawings and schematics were printed and studied and in every conversation he found a way to work in the word 'lift'.

The next National meet was soon upon us and Hubby was quite anxious to continue his conversation with Jim about the lift. On the way back home this time he tells me that Jim says that Joe had a Brand Z lift installed and he wants to see how happy Joe is with it before he orders the Brand X. Hubby immediately emails Joe to find out what he bought. Joe writes back that he did indeed buy a Brand Z and it is the perfect lift to own. Back to the computer goes Hubby, reading again all there is to know about the Brand Z lift and on the way home from the next meet he calls Brand Z on the phone and buys the lift. Happily he informs me that the lift will be delivered the following Thursday and we will be able to begin the turn signal installation. First though, we will need to clean the garage floor, he explained. So we spent the weekend sweeping and mop-ping and drying the floor until it looked too good to park a car on. The lift arrived, it was installed, Hubby listened intently to every word spoken by the serviceman and when I ar-rived home from work there it was, a beautiful spectacle, right in the middle of the garage. I was encouraged to drive the Model A onto the ramps and then Hubby proudly showed me how our wonderful lift worked.

We raised the Model A up and then we lowered it down; we did this several times finally leaving it in the up position. The reason for this, as Hubby explained to me, was since it is already up in the air, now would be an excellent time to drain the fluids and put in new fluids. And all this while I was thinking we only needed turn signals.

But before we can start this fluid replacement we are going to need a bench. Without a bench, we won't have any place to put the tools we are going to need, or store the volumes he has purchased that will tell us all we need to know about a Model A. We will build this bench our-selves and it will be a great bench. Now, I should let you know, that we have built benches before. One bench was built to hold a 150 gallon salt water fish tank. Upon its completion, it could easily have held a tank for Moby Dick and his brother.

But that was another time and this bench will be a real bench. It will have shelving, a great countertop, lighting and have electrical receptacles installed, so we won't have to use any extension cords. All the necessary items were purchased and the bench construction began. Upon its completion, I have to say that it is a beautiful bench, a bench that would look great in any room in the house. With the bench completed, the fluid exchange was begun. The differential oil exchange was followed by the transmission oil and then the engine and then the radia-tor; which then led to inspecting the wheel bearings and the

brakes and other items too numerous to mention at this time. The turn signals, you may ask, what about the turn signals? Well, early one Saturday morning we installed them without a hitch and drove the car to town that after-noon. Proudly

making left and right hand turns knowing that the vehicles following us knew exactly what direction we were heading in our perfect Model A.
