

## Strawberry Chiffon Pie


1 (3oz) pkg. sugar free strawberry gelatin 3/4 c. boiling water

1-1/4 c. cold water

1 c. frozen whipped topping, thawed 2-1/4c. Sliced fresh strawberries, divided 1 (8 inch) reduced fat graham cracker pie crust

In a large bowl dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Stir in cold water. Refrigerate until slightly thickened. Fold in the whipped topping and 2 cups of the strawberries. Pour into the crust. Refrigerate for 3 hours or until set. Garnish with the remaining strawberries. Makes 8 servings
