Upside Down Dutch Apple Pie



6-7 lg. apples, granny smith or good pie apples2 eggs3/4 c. sugar, brown or white1/2 c. melted shortening

- 1 c. flour
- 1 ton yon
- 1 tsp. vanilla 2 tsp. cinnamon

Peel and slice apples for pie. Place in a greased pan (9x13 or cookie sheet) and cover with cinnamon and sugar (mix together first...save 1/3 cup for top). Mix remaining ingredients and pour over apples. Sprinkle remaining cinnamon and sugar. Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes.

Web-Site Development Status Report

I have been busy, but have had a couple of conversations with Peter Gariepy from AACA. He is going to buy our domain name and send me the invoice. It's about \$15 every two years. I asked for waynedrumlinsauto.com. My research indicates that it's available. Peter suggested we might go with an acronym since it's easier to remember (e.g., wdauto.com), but I told him that I thought we needed the club name spelled out to make it real for club membership, especially some of the older, less web-savvy members. He understood completely. We also decided to go with open source products, such as wordpress.org or joomla.org (I'm looking at both). These are content management systems. What this means is that the web-site is built right on the server and is immediately available. I would use an internet browser to log onto the server to do updates, enhancements, etc. This is opposed to buying software for my PC, building a web-site on my PC, and then uploading it to the server. This type of web-site is hard-coded and needs to be reloaded to the server when changes are made. There's a learning curve on my part, but it shouldn't be anything I can't handle. The next step is to build a Word document with as much detail as possible. I thought I'd start this based on the scheme we have put together thus far. The Word doc then is used to fill the web-site using one of the open source products mentioned above. Hope this makes sense. It's a bit new to me, but it actually is the contemporary way to build and maintain a web-site. And given the pace that technology changes, we might as well get on board with the latest before it changes to the next "latest".




SOCK HOP
